**Reporting Requirements:** Not later than one hundred twenty days after the first meeting, the task force shall submit a report to the Higher Education and Employment Advancement Committee, in accordance with CGS 11-4a.

**Terms:** None specified; coterminous under CGS 4-1a. Any vacancy shall be filled by the appointing authority.

**Expected Termination:** The task force shall terminate on the date it submits its report.

## **PAID FAMILY AND MEDICAL LEAVE INSURANCE AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS (FMLABD )**

**Citation:** PA 19-25 s.2 as amended by PA 19-117 s.233

**Effective Date:** 06/26/19

**Composition:** 15 Members

**General Info:** All initial appointments to the board shall be made not later than July 1, 2019. Each member of the board shall, not later than ten calendar days after his or her appointment, take and subscribe the oath of affirmation required by article XI, section 1, of the Constitution of the state. The oath shall be filed in the office of the Secretary of the State. The authority shall be a body politic and corporate and shall constitute a public instrumentality and political subdivision of the state created for the performance of an essential public and governmental function. The authority shall not be construed to be a department, institution or agency of the state. No member of the board or any officer, agent or employee of the authority shall, directly or indirectly, have any financial interest in any corporation, business trust, estate, trust, partnership or association, two or more persons having a joint or common interest, or any other legal or commercial entity contracting with the authority. Each officer or member of the board authorized by resolution of the board to handle funds or sign checks for the program shall, not later than ten calendar days after the date the board adopts such authorizing resolution, execute a surety bond in the penal sum of fifty thousand dollars or procure an equivalent insurance product or, in lieu thereof, the chairperson shall obtain a blanket position bond covering the executive director and each member of the board and other employee or authorized officer of the authority in the penal sum of fifty thousand dollars. The provisions of this section and CGS 1-125, as amended by PA 19-25, shall apply to any member, director or employee of the authority. No person shall be subject to civil liability for the debts, obligations or liabilities of the authority as provided in this section and CGS 1-125, as amended PA 19-25.

**Chair Info:** The Governor shall select a chairperson of the board from among the members. The board shall annually elect a vice-chairperson and such other officers as it deems necessary from among its members.

**Compensation:** The members of the board shall serve without compensation but shall, within available appropriations, be reimbursed in accordance with the standard travel regulations for all necessary expenses that they may incur through service on the board.

**Quorum:** A majority of the voting members of the board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business or the exercise of any power of the authority. Except as specified in CGS 1-121 and subdivision (14) of subsection (b) of section 4 of substitute PA 19-25, the affirmative vote of a majority of voting members present at a meeting of the board shall be sufficient for action taken by the board.

**Terms:** Each member appointed by the Legislative Leaders or the Governor shall serve an initial term of four years. Thereafter, Legislative Leaders and the Governor shall appoint members of the board to succeed such appointees whose terms have expired and each member so appointed shall hold office for a term of three years from July first in the year of his or her appointment. Members shall hold office until a successor member has been duly appointed. Any vacancy shall be filled by the appointing authority not later than thirty calendar days after the office becomes vacant. Any member previously appointed to the board may be reappointed.

**Resignation:** Any member who fails to attend three consecutive meetings or who fails to attend fifty per cent of all meetings held during any calendar year shall be deemed to have resigned from the board.

**Expected Termination:** The authority shall continue as long as the program remains in effect and until its existence is terminated by law. Upon termination of the existence of the authority, all its rights and properties shall pass to and be vested in the state of Connecticut.

**COUNCIL ON PROTECTING WOMEN'S HEALTH (WOMENSHEALTH )**

**Citation:** PA 19-70 s.1

**Effective Date:** 07/01/19

**Composition:** 20 Members

**General Member Qualifications:** The membership of the council shall fairly and adequately represent women who have had issues accessing quality health care in the state.

**General Info:** All appointments to the council shall be made not later than sixty days after July 1, 2019. The council shall meet at least quarterly. The Joint Committee on Legislative Management shall provide administrative support to the chairpersons of the council and assistance in convening the council's meetings.

**Chair Info:** The council shall elect two cochairpersons from among its members.

**Compensation:** Members of the council shall serve without compensation, except for necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

**Reporting Requirements:** Not later than January 1, 2020, and annually thereafter, the council shall submit a report, in accordance with CGS 11-4a, to the Public Health and Insurance committees.

**Terms:** Two-year terms and no public member shall serve for more than two consecutive terms. Any vacancy shall be filled by the appointing authority.

**Expected Termination:** The task force shall terminate on the date that it submits its report or January 1, 2020, whichever is later.

**General Info:** The staff of the Commission on Women, Children, Seniors, Equity and Opportunity shall serve as the organizing and administrative staff of the advisory board.

**Chair Info:** Members appointed by the Senate President Pro Tempore and the Speaker of the House shall serve as cochairpersons.

**Compensation:** Within available appropriations, parent and family participants of the Two-Generational Initiative may be compensated for time and travel related to Two-Generational Advisory Board meetings and Two-Generational Initiative activities related to asset building, leadership and community engagement.

**Reporting Requirements:** Not later than December 31, 2020, and annually thereafter, the board, in consultation with OPM, shall report, in accordance with CGS 11-4a, to the Children’s, Education, Housing, Human Services, Labor, Public Health, Transportation and Appropriations committees.

**Terms:** None specified; coterminous under CGS 4-1a.
